

Gender Pay Gap Statement 2022

From 2017, any organisation with 250 or more employees must publish and report specific figures about their gender pay gap. The gender pay gap is the difference between the average earnings of men and women, expressed relative to men's earnings.

Orange Genie Cover Ltd employed more than 250 people on the snapshot date of the 5th April 2022 and we are pleased to publish calculations made in accordance with The Equality Act 2010 (Gender Pay Gap Information) Regulations 2017.

The table below shows the calculations required by the Regulations as at the snapshot date of 5th April 2022.

The mean and median hourly pay and bonus gaps between men and women are expressed as a percentage difference to the men's pay and bonus values and so a positive value indicates a gap in favour of men and a negative value in favour of women.
